Borys Gudziak as the seventh Metropolitan-Archbishop for the Ukrainian Catholic Archeparchy of Philadelphia, which will take place on **Tuesday, June 4, 2019**, at the Ukrainian Catholic Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Philadelphia, PA.
